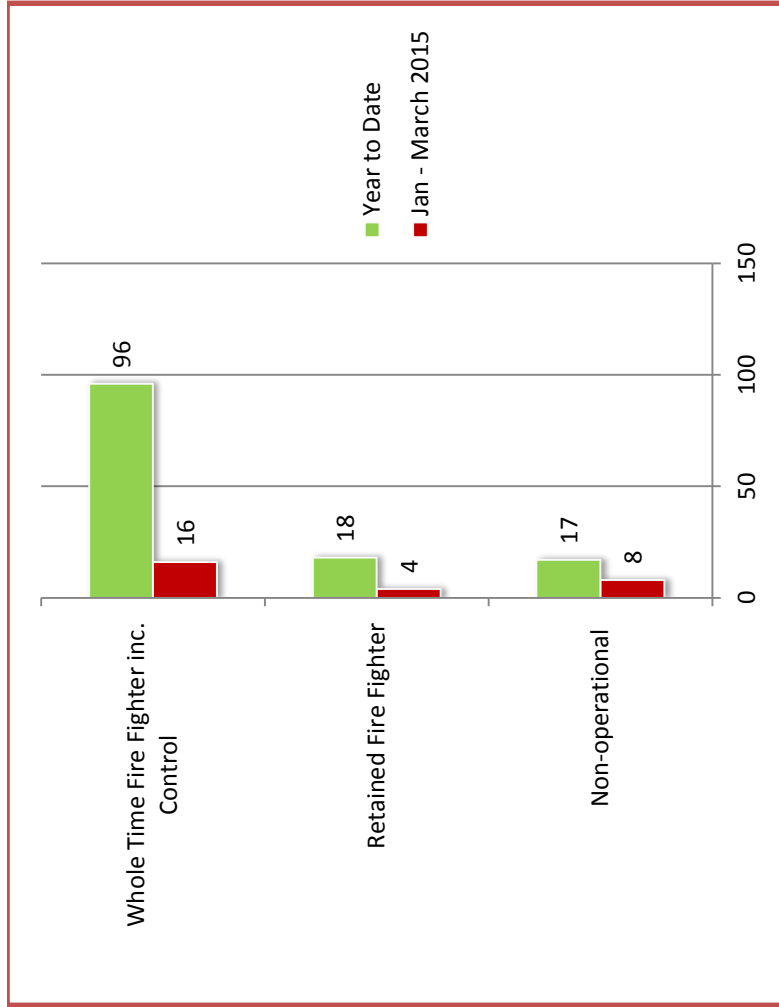


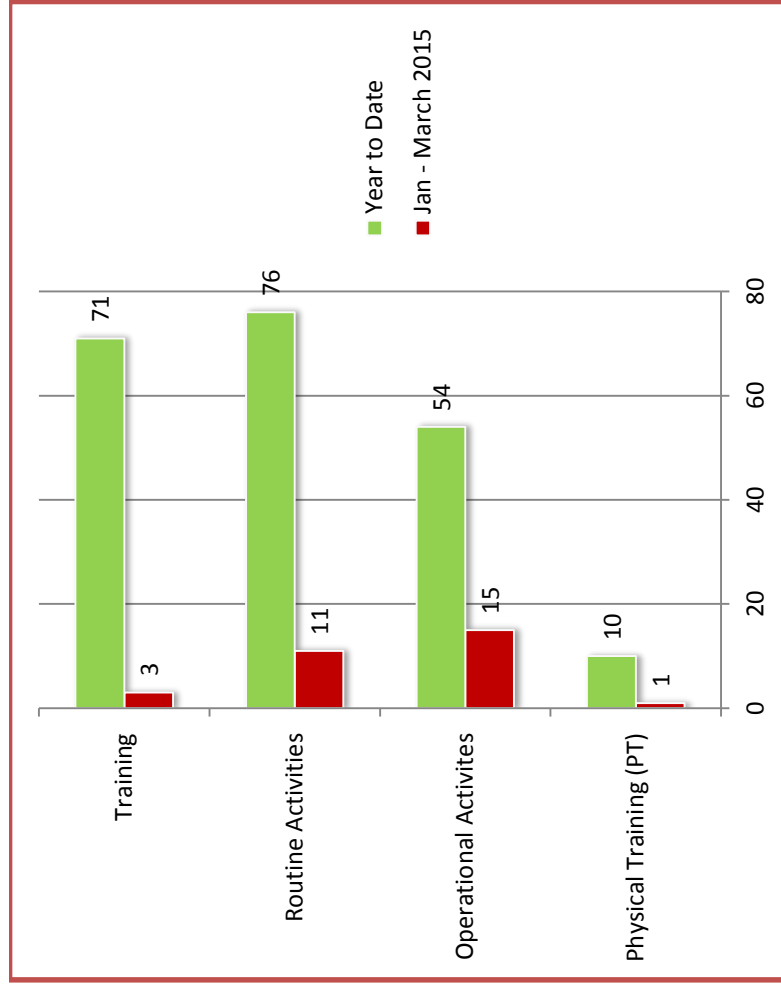
Role



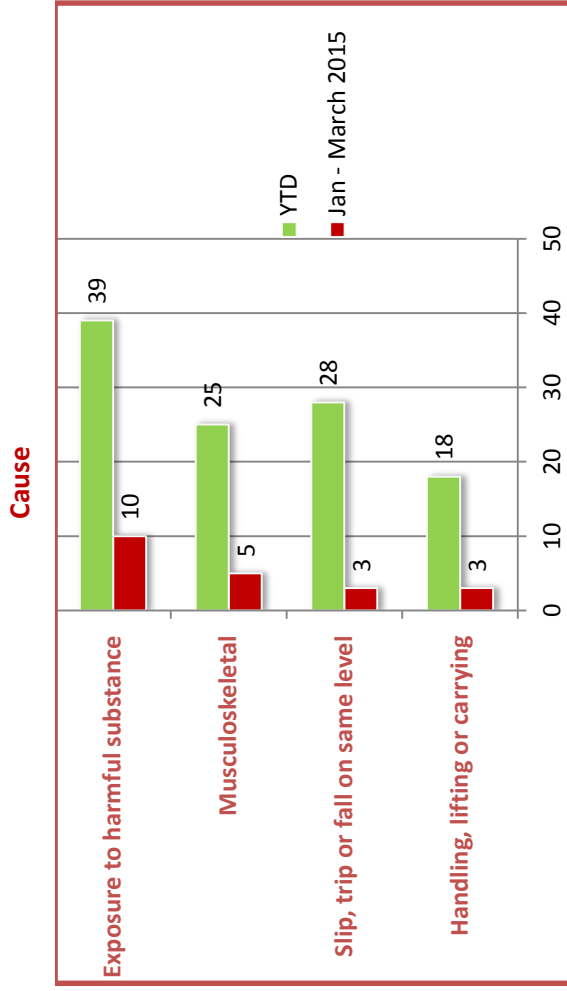
The graph above shows role specific incidents for this period alongside a running Year to Date total.

The data shows that Whole Time Fire Fighters (inc. Control) are recording more incidents than Retained Fire Fighters and Non-operational personnel. This could be due to the level of activity which whole-time crews experience and the fact that this group accounts for nearly 3/5 of all operational personnel.

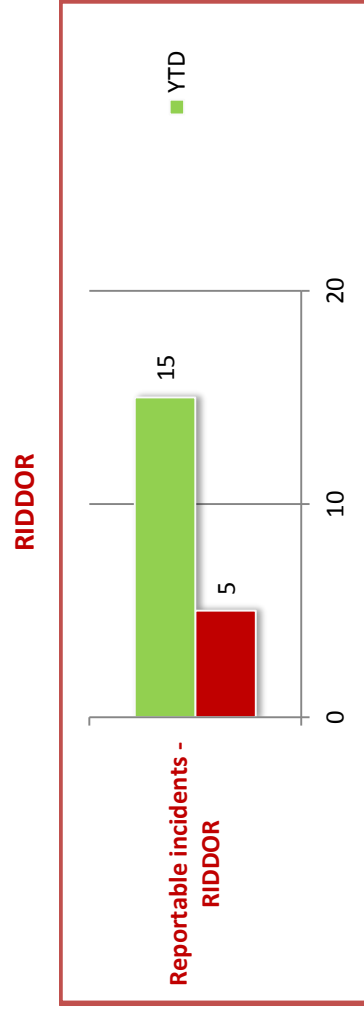

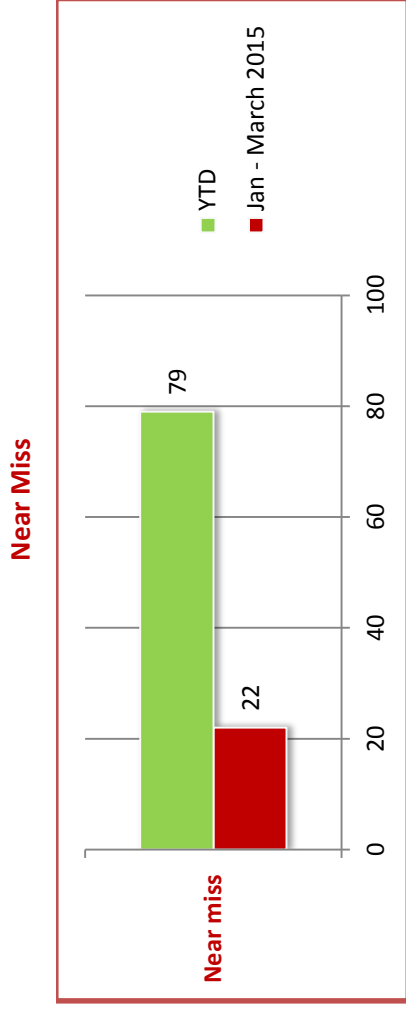
The information above relates to the activities which were being undertaken at the time of the recorded incident.



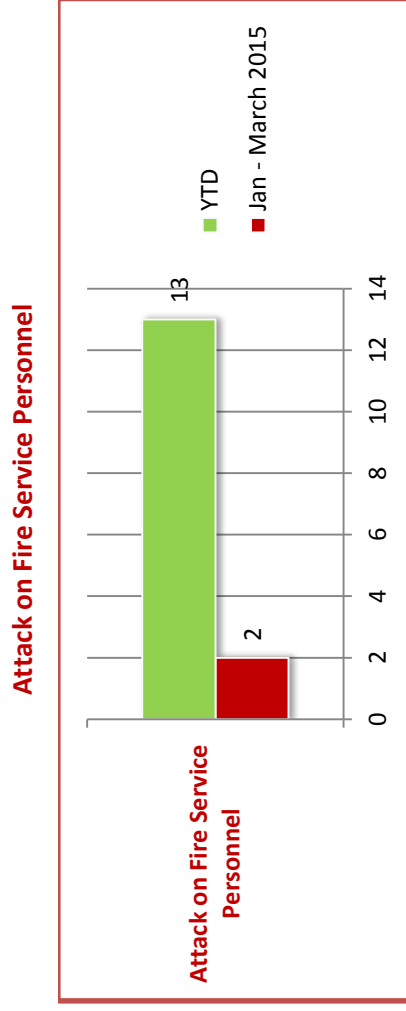
Type of incident - the graph shows the top three poorest performing factors for this quarter alongside the Year to Date figure (2 causes were joint 3rd). 9 exposures to harmful substances relate to one incident during an incident at a high rise building; safe systems of work have been reviewed as a precautionary measure.



The majority of this quarters RIDDOR reportable incidents (4) are due to over 7 day injuries. One was a dangerous occurrence report due to a release of asbestos.



The Service has seen a positive increase in Near Miss reporting for this quarter as a result of the HS&E Team carrying out pro-active work on near miss reporting.



2 attack reports contribute to the Year to Date total. They both involved verbal and physical abuse; one of which resulted in a citizen's arrest by the fire crew. As a result the individual was found guilty of using threatening, abusive or insulting words or behaviour which could have led to violence.
