Rescues

Between 1st April 2015 and 31st December 2015 the Service rescued 587 people in incidents across Humberside and bordering FRS areas of which, 4 of the rescues were in North Yorkshire area.

The table below shows the number of people rescued and the type of incident for the end of the 3rd quarter period October 2015 to December 2015.

Outcomes

SPI 2.2 has increased mainly due to a rise in car fires. There are plans in place to deal with this in conjunction with the police and other agencies.

SPI 2.3a remains green and is largely unchanged due to ongoing local and Service-wide strategies.

SPI 2.3c is now green after action plans with partner agencies.

SPI 2.4 shows a slight increase on last quarter due mainly to a rise during October/November in Hull and NLCPU. Action plans are ongoing. The increase in terms of actual numbers across the Service is low.

SPI 2.5 remains low. The increase in terms of actual numbers across the Service is low.
