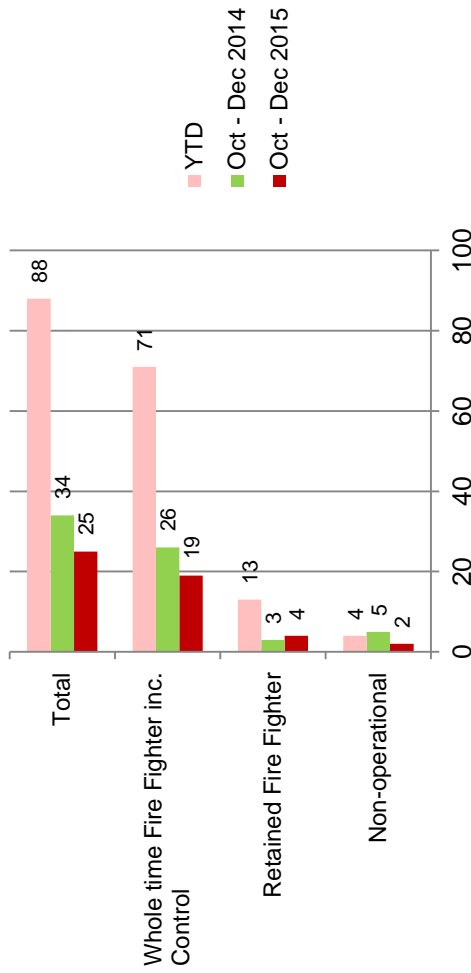


3rd Quarter (October – December 2015) HS&E Performance Snap-shot

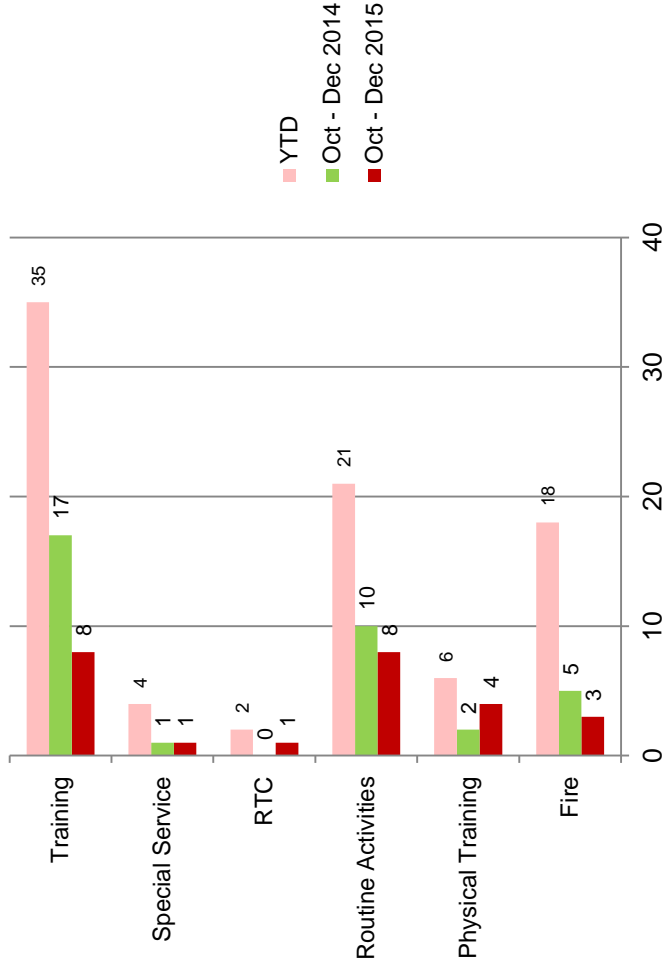
Role



The chart above shows role specific incidents for this period (Oct - Dec 2015) alongside comparison from the same quarter from the previous year and a year to date total.

The data shows that Whole Time Fire Fighters are recording more unwanted events than Retained Fire Fighters and Non-operational personnel. This is mainly due to the nature of their role and the environments to which they are exposed, the fact that this group accounts for 49% of all Service personnel, Whole Time Fire Fighters are also at work longer than their Retained counterparts within the operational arena.

Activity



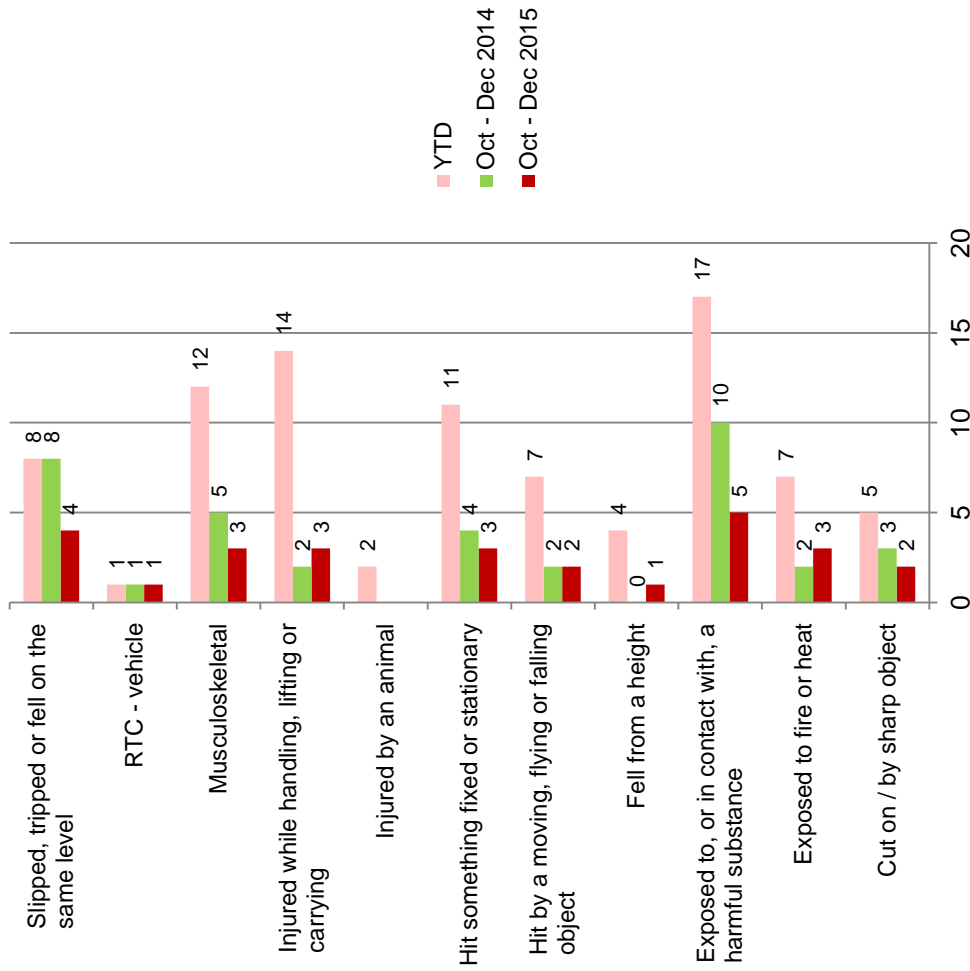
The chart above relates to the Activities undertaken at the time of the recorded incident. Unwanted events are occur more frequently during training activities and routines activities.

This is because training activities and routine activities are undertaken more frequently than other activities undertaken by employees.

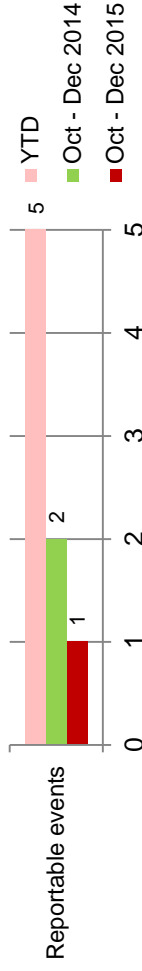


Cause



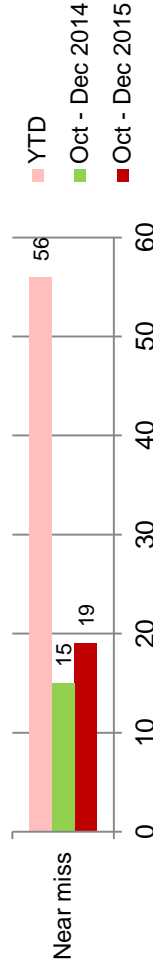
The chart shows the *cause* of unwanted events for this quarter compared against the same period from the previous year and a year to date total. The overall trend shows a reduction in the amounts of unwanted events, and of those occurring many are relatively minor.

RIDDOR



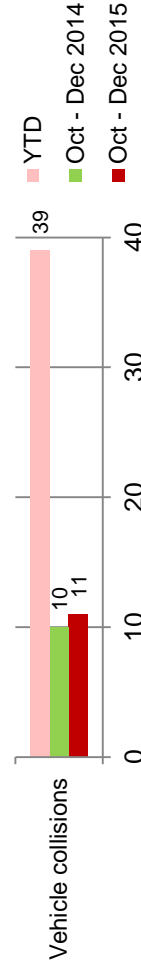
The charts shows the number of *RIDDOR* reportable incidents continue to decrease which is very positive and demonstrates the continual improvement and culture change in the Service

Near Miss



The chart shows that identifying and recording *near miss* events is still increasing and are having a positive impact on the number of preventable accidents occurring.

Vehicle Collisions



The chart shows the number of *vehicle collisions*, these are forwarded to the driver training team to determine trends and/or training needs. The recorded incidents are mostly minor.
